

INSTITUTIONAL PROJECT OVERVIEW

FOCUS: One Goal, One Community, Sustainability builds on all the previous service-learning and community development initiatives of MCL. The various programs, colleges, and departments of MCL conceptualized and implemented projects and activities that address the needs of the community under the institutional advocacy while also highlighting strengths according to fields of expertise. The initiatives implemented under the umbrella of the FOCUS Project also emphasized, collaborative, and inter-disciplinary action among different proponents from the Colleges and Departments.

The **College of Arts and Science (CAS)** continued previous efforts and has FOCUSED on delivering socio-capacity building initiatives such as reading, writing, and community workshops; content training for teachers and students; and development of learning materials. In addition, general environmental awareness seminars were also conducted by CAS.

The **College of Computer and Information Science (CCIS)** FOCUSED on developing its previous efforts of promoting IT Literacy among partner communities. Public school teachers from various partner communities were given trainings and workshops depending on their specific needs. CCIS also continues to maintain and develop website hosting projects that provide a platform for online connectivity to partner communities.

The **College of Maritime Education and Training (CMET)** FOCUSED on projects and programs that addressed environmental and social needs. These initiatives focused on providing trainings and workshops for environmental stewardship and leadership. In partnership with various organizations, CMET also conducted blood donation drives and medical missions.

The **E.T. Yuchengco College of Business (ETYCB)** FOCUSED on implementing initiatives that would help partner communities to build their skills

thereby helping in improving their livelihood. Workshops and seminars on housekeeping, tour guiding, and basic finance and accounting were conducted. Moreover, ETYCB raised funds to help partner communities with infrastructure needs.

The **Mapúa Institute of Technology at Laguna (MITL)** FOCUSED on projects and programs that addressed the infrastructure and socio-capacity building needs of partner communities. These initiatives include workshops and trainings as well as infrastructure design and building. Emphasis is given to equipping the partner communities with technical know-how for long-term viability.

The **Senior High School (SHS)** Department FOCUSED on initiatives that exposed the students to the various needs of the community. These projects and programs provided a platform that allowed the students to engage in community service activities aligned to their courses and fields of expertise.

The various student organizations and departments of MCL also implemented initiatives that allowed the students to FOCUS on their respective disciplines and capabilities.

In addition to these, MCL has responded to the needs of partner communities during the Taal Volcanic Eruption in January 2020 and is continuously conducting initiatives as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Overall, the service-learning and community engagement initiatives that were implemented FOCUSED on forging effective partnerships and conquering the difficult challenges that the world and this country are experiencing thus far. Collectively, this embodies the commitment of MCL to pursue One Goal and One Community towards a long-term journey to establish Sustainability.





SAVE Stand and Volunteer for Empowerment

Taal Eruption Relief Operations

Over 11,000 evacuees were reached by MCL CSCE's SAVE Taal Relief Operations spanning from January 15-26, 2020. The institutions relief operations, Stand And Volunteer for Empowerment (SAVE) has gathered 278 volunteer MCL students, staff, and faculty members to participate in its 3-week operation.

The Taal Volcano erupted on the afternoon of January 12, 2020, causing a widespread ashfall in nearby communities. The ashfall reached as far as Metro Manila and Pampanga, and has greatly covered the provinces of Cavite, Laguna, and especially Batangas. In response, MCL, led by MCL CSCE quickly organized a relief operation enjoining students, staff and faculty members to volunteer in Donation Drives and Feeding programs.

The SAVE Taal Relief Operations have reached 19 Evacuation Centers and Barangays in Cavite, Batangas and Laguna. Volunteers helped in food preparation and distribution with assigned barangays in the three provinces.

Through this partnership with PRC-Laguna, MCL is able to provide relief assistance, pandemic prevention kits to communities, and support to health workers and other frontliner groups.


MCL CSCE is in full support of the brave health workers in their fight against COVID-19. Together with the Philippine



COVID-19 Case Tracker FOR LAGUNA

COVID-19 cases in the province of Laguna and provide important data at a glance. This project is spearheaded by the Dean Khristian G. Kikuchi of CCIS, with the team composed of CCIS professors, alumni, and students. The team aims to provide relevant information on the ongoing COVID-19 cases in the province down to the level of cities, municipalities, and if available, even in the barangay level. With the goal to give everyone hope, the dashboard will be highlighting the number of recovered cases and remaining active cases. The tracker can also be viewed using mobile devices.

In an effort to help with the nation's ongoing fight against the virus, CCIS formed a team to develop a web-based dashboard to track the number of

In times of the COVID-19 pandemic, any kind of support matters.

Launched in April 2020, CSCE launched MCL Speaks: A Positivity Campaign for COVID-19 Frontliners. It is an advocacy to spread support and care to the health workers and first responders who are in the frontlines amidst the pandemic. The MCL community, families, and friends were encouraged to send their message of hope and support to the frontliners, in any form of medium, from artworks to vlogs, to simple written messages. The messages were posted on the MCL CSCE Facebook pages in batches. The first one dropped on April 20, 2020, while subsequent batches were released on May 5, 15, and 21, 2020 respectively.

The campaign kicked off with the premiere of the song "Tanaw", an original musical composition by Prof. Algene de Guzman of the College of Arts and Science (CAS), and arranged by CAS student Mhonver Lopez, whose song composed and written with fellow CAS alumna Japs Concepcion titled "Mas Mabuti Pa" placed as one of the Top 10 Finalists of Himig Handog 2018: Love Songs & Love Stories. The song was performed by MCL faculty, staff, students, and alumni. Its accompanying music video, produced and edited by Mr. Drew Guese of MCL CSCE, was launched on April 17, 2020 on the MCL CSCE Facebook page.

As of August 2020, the video has garnered over 21,000 views, 1,000+ shares, and 780+ reactions from the Facebook page. Since then, the song was featured on Inquirer Libre, Go Philippines and DZJV 1458 Radyo CALABARZON. The song's message is about gratitude to the frontliners who are currently battling the virus.

To continue the advocacy of positivity and encouragement to our frontliners, MCL CSCE also produced a two-night online concert event titled "Musika Mo, Tatanawin Ko: A Concert of Hope Dedicated to our Dear Frontliners". It was broadcasted live on the MCL CSCE Facebook page on June 13 and 14, 2020. The concert was hosted by Dustin Divina and Therese Macasaet, both students from the B.A. Communication (BA COMM) program of CAS, remotely from their own homes. A total of seventeen (17) performers were part of the line-up. All performances were pre-recorded at home and split into batches for each night. During the broadcast, an interactive section, in which the hosts reads the messages of hope to frontliners sent in from viewers, was also held inbetween performances.

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
