Executive Summary Engaging Connected Communities

Humans are social creatures - no distance can keep people apart. With the emerging communication technologies and the commanding presence of social media, individuals have maximized their potential more so with the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic. Though it has triumphed in restricting physical mobility and distancing, it did not deter one's desire to stay connected despite the difficulties and uncertainties it has wrought on human lives.

The Center for Service-Learning and Community Engagement (CSCE) has stayed connected and kept its initiatives afloat for its stakeholders through the second year of the pandemic. It has ignited the spirit of volunteerism among the students, administrators, faculty members, and staff of Malayan Colleges Laguna, A Mapúa School (MCL), as the scale and gravity of the economic and social

conditions have pushed some people to the edge. CSCE continuously facilitated service-learning (SL) and community engagement (CE) initiatives through conscious and sustainable efforts to address the needs of our community partners during the global health pandemic.

Several initiatives such as the Brigada Eskwela, donation drives, online webinars, and virtual events were implemented to benefit our partner schools and communities. In March 2022, CSCE launched a new advocacy - Gender and Development (GAD) - in fulfillment of the memorandum issued by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) that establishes the guidelines on GAD in higher education institutions or HEIs. Hence, CSCE conducted activities in support of the celebration of International Women's Month which focused on the trifocal functions of

HEIs - instruction, research, and extension as well as highlighting the women leaders within the MCL community. 2022 was also a historic moment for Filipinos - the May 9 national elections was the first political exercise conducted under the COVID-19 pandemic conditions. Through the joint initiative of the College of Arts and Science (CAS) and KAMALAYAN (MCL's student multimedia journalism platform), the MCL community expressed its solidarity with the entire nation by casting their votes and expressing their opinions on burning political issues. These initiatives showed that CSCE pursued development not just from within but also extending to our partner communities.


With the collective effort of everyone involved, over 70,000 beneficiaries from 36 partner communities, organizations, and institutions were reached for academic year

This report, with the theme Engaging Connected Communities, amounted from all the collective efforts of each program, colleges, and departments of MCL, as they proposed and implemented different service-learning and community engagement activities which brought forth coordination and strengthened partnerships. As all executed their projects under their respective field of expertise, not one compromised the quality of service delivered as each project was served with the advancement of collaboration and solidifying the spirit of volunteerism through extension work despite the challenges brought upon by the pandemic.

The College of Computer and Information Science (CCIS) kept their close coordination with their partner schools to further their goal of promoting IT literacy among Senior High School students. By managing the continuity of IT-relevant projects, CCIS was able to teach the students how to code through computer programming courses and have them made their own version of a web game, which brought them a step closer to actualizing their goal, which was to nurture young talents to make a name in the IT industry.

The Mapúa-PTC College of Maritime Education and Training (Mapúa-PTC CMET) highlighted the importance of education despite the societal and economic challenges brought upon by the COVID-19 pandemic. This crisis brought forth a shortage in budget resulting in a lack of educational materials and equipment. They addressed this issue by spearheading a fundraising activity which sought to raise funds which in turn was used to secure the necessary educational materials and then turned over to its partner school communities.

Institutional Project Overview





The E.T. Yuchengco College of Business (ETYCB) executed different SL and CE initiatives focused on providing primary support for the livelihood of the partner communities and establishing a grounded relationship with organizations beyond MCL's reach such as Care for Paws Shelter Sanctuary Inc. Additionally, a workshop about proper financial budgeting was facilitated by B.S. Accountancy students where they taught students the different concepts of accounting and how to use the rule of debit and credit to balance out their finances. Throughout their implementation, ETYCB collectively raised both monetary and in-kind provisions which were donated to numerous partner communities just in time for the holidays.

The Mapúa Institute of Technology at Laguna (MITL) utilized their technical know-how to address the needs of their partner communities such as contributing funds in building a water pump for the Dumagat tribe in Gabaldon and Dingalan, Nueva Ecija, which is known to have difficulty in accessing clean sources of water. Aside from the aforementioned initiative, different academic organizations from MITL started their own fundraising activities, which helped them to raise enough funding to allocate enough budget for their donations to each

Aside from the colleges and departments, various non-academic organizations pursued excellence by living up to the core values of MCL: Excellence, Teamwork, Loyalty, Urgency, and Discipline.

MCL has been proven to have lived up to its mission of contributing to the solution of the industry's and society's problems through the expert application of knowledge. Despite all the setbacks experienced this past year, MCL managed to respond to the needs of its partner communities proactively. Through the collective efforts of everyone involved, MCL engraved sustainability and social development by **Engaging Connected Communities.**




